Tyler is the light of Sabrina's life. Not only that, he's also her biggest cheerleader and supporter. Although only seven, he is quite responsible – Tyler helps around the house with taking out the garbage, cleaning up after himself and cleaning his room. His responsibility will come in handy for his future – he wants to join the military when he grows up.

Sabrina wants to continue empowering her son by teaching him self-worth, self-confidence and that education is extremely important. Tyler continues to be involved in the community through the reading club at the library.

"The biggest difference between the current living situation and the new house will be space, privacy and a peace of mind. Something we haven't had in a while. A home to me is security, stability, love and support," Sabrina said.
